Research focus: examining the sociopolitical dynamics of Amhara ethnonationalism in Ethiopia


Objectives:

Key Findings

Triggering Causes:

- Ethnic federalism as an enabling framework for ethnic mobilization.
- Structural discontents of ethnic federalism and perceived marginalization.
- Post-2018 political transition: intensified mobilization.

Embedded Narratives:

- Counter-Narrating 'Ethnic Oppression' thesis.
- Reclaiming ethnic identity: detaching Amhara identity from imperial connotations.
- Narratives of defending state unity

Implications for state structure

- Reshaping the political order: seeks constitutional reform, narrative shift, and territorial integrity, pairing ethnic assertion with national unity.
- Risks of security dilemmas with counter-mobilization
- Signals existential crises but also opportunities for reform.

- The movement is a reactive, narrative-driven movement with potential to reshape Ethiopia's polity.
- It reflects Ethiopia's entrenched struggle over history and memory, a 'temporal paralysis' where the past dominates the present and constrains the future.
